## **People to soon get benefit of government services from 81 sewa kendars in district: Deputy Commissioner**

- **Established at a cost of Rs. 12.29 crore**
- **Appreciable effort of Punjab Government of providing services at doorstep to people**
- **11 sewa kendars constructed in urban & 70 in rural areas**

Moga, February 23:

The construction work of 81 integrated sewa kendars in the district is in the final stages and soon people would start getting various government services from these kendars which have cost Rs. 12 crore 28 lakh and 72 thousand to the state exchequer.

Disclosing this, the Deputy Commissioner, Mr. Kuldeep Singh Vaid said that the main aim of these sewa kendars is to provide various services under one roof to people of rural and far off areas which are being given under Right To Service Act in the district by various departments. He said that as per the governance reforms initiatives commenced under the leadership of Deputy Chief Minister, Punjab, S. Sukhbir Singh Badal, an integrated sewa kendar is established after a cluster of every 4 villages in order to provide services to people of the state at their doorstep.

Giving details, Mr. Kuldeep Singh Vaid said that in Moga, the public works department (B & R) has established 37 integrated sewa kendars at a cost of Rs. 5 crore 60 lac 50 thousand in Dharamkot and Nihal Singh Wala tehsils. Out of these, 31 sewa kendars have come up in rural areas. He further said that 6 of these kendars are of type-2 while 31 are of type-3 with cost being Rs. 18.50 lakh and Rs. 14.50 lakh each respectively. Out of these, type-2 kendars have come up at Dharamkot-1, Dharamkot-2, Kot Ise Khan, Nihal Singh Wala-1 & 2 and Badhni Kalann. He also informed that 31 type-3 sewa kendars in rural areas have been completed and these have been constructed at Villages Fatehgarh Panjtoor, Dholewala, Mandir, Datewala, Daulewala Mayar, Kalia, Balkhandi, Khosa Kotla, Janer, Kariyal, Jalalabad East, Badduwal, Fatehgarh Korotana, Bhinder Kalan, Kokri Vehniwal, Kishanpur Kalan, Kamaal Ke, Firozewal, Badaa, Kot Sadar Khan of Dharamkot tehsil and Villages Dina Sahib, Saido Ke, Patto Hira Singh, Himmatpura, Khaai, Raunta, Manuke, Rauke Kalan, Loapon, Bilaspur, Ransinh Kalan and Ranian of Nihal Singh Wala tehsil.

The Deputy Commissioner further said that Panchayati Raj Department is giving finishing touches to construction of 44 integrated sewa kendars in Moga and Baghapurana tehsils of the district, which has cost Rs. 6 crore 68 lac 22 thousand. Out of these, 5 have been constructed in urban and are of type-2 and the rest 39 constructed in rural areas are of type-3. With the cost being Rs. 19.14 lakh and Rs. 14.68 lakh each respectively. Divulging more, he said that 5 type-2 sewa kendars have come up at near office of Municipal Council Baghapurana, Old dikki side Moga, Sodhian mohalla near bibi da gurudwara Moga, Lande Ke and Municipal Council Moga. Giving more details, he informed that 39 sewa kendars of rural areas have been constructed at village Mahla Kalan, Nathuwala Garbi, Rode, Langeana Nawaan, Rajeana, Gholia Kalan, Budh Singh Wala, Sangatpura, Samadh Bhai, Tharaj, Sukhanand, Thatthi Bhai, Mari Mustafa, Mall Ke, Samalsar, Ajitwal, Buttar Kalan, Dala, Mehron, Charikk Patti Sarkar of tehsil Baghapurana and villages Budh

Singh Wala, Chuharchak, Daudhar Sharki, Dhudike, Mehna, Kokri Kalan, Rauli, Singhanwala, Daroli Bhai, Saleena, Khukhrana, Darapur, Ghall Kalan, Dagra, Talwandi Bhangerian, Dhalle Ke, Chand Nawaan, Gill and Vadda Ghar of tehsil Moga.
